This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

On 6/21/18, an SCR report was received alleging that on 6/20/18, the parent substitute was driving while intoxicated with the 10 yo SC and the 9 yo SS in the car. The PS drove into a pole and the 9 yo, who was secured in the vehicle, sustained multiple fractures to his legs and arms. The SC was not wearing a seat belt and was ejected from the car. As a result, the SC sustained a traumatic brain injury, multiple fractures, and organ failure. At 4:38 PM on 6/21/18, the SC died as a result of the injuries he sustained in the accident. The mother and the father had unknown roles.

Executive Summary

An SCR report of a fatality was received by Sullivan Department of Social Services (SCDSS) on 6/21/18, was a subsequent to an open child protective investigation received on 6/20/18. The SCR report received on 6/20/18 alleged the parent substitute was driving while his ability was impaired by drugs and lost control of the vehicle, hitting a pole. The 10 yo SC was thrown from the vehicle and sustained multiple traumatic injuries. The SC was transported by helicopter to Westchester Medical Center (WMC) and was immediately put on life support. Subsequently, the SC was taken off life support and died as a result of the injuries he sustained in the accident. The SC was pronounced dead at 4:28 PM on 6/21/18. The report also alleged the 9 yo SS was also in the vehicle and sustained multiple fractures. The mother was listed as a subject as she knew the PS was impaired and had him drive the children to school that morning after they had missed the bus.

SCDSS assessed the immediate safety of the SS by contacting the hospital and the father of the SS, and coordinating with Westchester County Department of Social Services (WCDSS) to meet with the mother at WMC and assess the father's home as he resided in Westchester County. WCDSS met with the mother and she was uncooperative with WCDSS and denied the PS was impaired. SCDSS attempted to meet with the mother but were unsuccessful in their attempts. WCDSS assessed the safety of the father's home prior to the SS's release from the hospital. There were no safety concerns noted.

On 6/22/18, the father was granted sole custody of the SS under an Article 6 custody petition. The judge issued a stay away order of protection (OP) prohibiting contact between the mother and the SS. SCDSS provided the hospital with the OP for the SS's protection during his hospital stay.

SCDSS learned from LE that the PS was arrested on multiple charges and remained in jail with no bail. On 6/22/18, LE located the mother and she was arrested on two counts of endangering the welfare of a child and criminal possession of a controlled substance, and was arraigned in town court. A criminal stay away order of protection against the mother was issued by the town court judge on behalf of the SS.

On 6/25/18, SCDSS filed an Article 10 Abuse/Neglect petition in Family Court against the mother for the SC and the SS. On 6/26/18, the Judge granted a continuation of the previously issued OP against the mother on behalf of the SS pending further proceedings. The SS remained in the sole custody of the father under the Article 6 custody.

The ME's final autopsy report findings revealed the cause of death was blunt force trauma of the body with fractures to the skull and lower extremity; contusions of brain and lung; intrameningeal hemorrhages; and cerebral edema.

SCDSS substantiated the allegations against the PS and the mother for the SC and the SS. Based on interviews and documentation received from LE, medical personnel and based on LE's interview with the SS, there was credible evidence

that the actions/inactions of the mother and the PS caused the death of the SC and the injuries to the SS. The SS told LE the PS fell asleep and the SC undid his seat belt in an attempt to wake the PS prior to the accident. LE executed a search warrant of the home shortly after the accident and found illegal drugs and drug paraphernalia throughout the home. A criminal history check revealed a significant history of drug use by the PS and the mother. The case was IND and opened pending further Family Court proceedings.

LDSS Response

On 6/21/18, SCDSS received an SCR report about the death of the SC. This report was a subsequent to a report received the previous day regarding the injuries to the SC and the SS as a result of a motor vehicle accident. The report alleged the PS was driving the children to school after they missed the bus. The PS was driving under the influence of drugs when the accident occurred. On 6/20/18, SCDSS learned the SC was not expected to live.

SCDSS learned from LE the PS was arrested on multiple charges including vehicular manslaughter in the first degree and was being held in jail without bail. LE provided SCDSS with documentation and statements obtained about the accident. LE interviewed the SS and the SS told LE that the SC had undone his seat belt to wake the PS who had fallen asleep while driving prior to the accident. The SS was properly secured in the vehicle at the time of the accident. The SC was air lifted to WMC due to the seriousness of his injuries. LE said the mother was refusing to cooperate and denied PS was misusing drugs. LE executed a search warrant and found drugs and drug paraphilia at the residence.

SCDSS completed an SCR and criminal history check. The PS and the mother had multiple arrests involving illegal drug use. The father had no criminal history.

SCDSS coordinated with Westchester County Department of Social Services to meet with the mother at Westchester Medical Center. WCDSS met with the mother and she refused to cooperate with WCDSS. The mother said, "I was not in the car and my boyfriend was not high." WCDSS gave the mother the name and phone number of the SCDSS and encouraged her to contact SCDSS.

SCDSS spoke with the father who lived in Westchester County. SCDSS coordinated with WCDSS to conduct a home visit of the father's home. WCDSS observed the father's home and there were no noted safety concerns. SCDSS continued to attempt to contact the mother without success.

SCDSS learned from LE that the mother was located and arrested on 6/22/18 on 2 counts of endangering the welfare of a child and criminal possession of a controlled substance. The mother was arraigned in town court and was released on bail. The town court Judge issued a stay away ordered of protection (OP) on behalf of the SS. The mother was ordered to have no contact with the SS.

The father was granted sole custody of the SS under an Article 6 custody petition on 6/22/18. The Family Court Judge issued a stay away order of protection (OP) on behalf of the SS. SCDSS provided the hospital social worker with a copy of the OP. The SS was released from the hospital on 6/25/18 to his father's care in Westchester County. On 6/25/18, SCDSS filed an Article 10 Abuse/Neglect petition in SCFC. The petition was heard on 6/26/18. The OP remained in place on behalf of the SS, the mother was to have no contact with the SS pending further SCFC proceedings. The SS remained in the sole custody of the father under Article 6.

The father told SCDSS he had ongoing concerns about the mother's possible drug use and had previously expressed those concerns to SCFC and SCDSS. The father had shared custody and had been trying to obtain full custody of the children for several years. SCDSS spoke with school staff who had observed the PS and the mother on school grounds and they appeared to be under the influence of drugs just days before the accident.

On 10/11/18, the mother consented to a finding of Abuse/Neglect in Family Court on behalf of the children. The mother was ordered to remain under the supervision of SCDSS By the Family Court Judge. The Mother was ordered by the Family Court Judge to follow all treatment recommendations. WCDSS connected the father and the SS with counseling services and the SS was to have no contact with the mother until her therapist and the SS's therapist agreed it would be therapeutically appropriate.

The mother initially did not cooperate with SCDSS. SCDSS sent the mother referrals for services and continued to try and engage the mother in services. Report Summary:

An SCR report alleged on 6/20/18 the parent substitute was driving while intoxicated with SS and SC in the vehicle. The mother was aware the PS was driving impaired. The PS hit a pole with the vehicle causing the vehicle to be torn in half. The SC was sitting in the backseat without a seat belt on and was ejected from the vehicle. The SC was brain dead and on life support. The SC sustained a skull fracture, multiple leg fractures and lacerations all over his body. The SC was expected to succumb to his injuries. The SS sustained a several fractures.

Report Determination: Indicated **Date of Determination:** 07/16/2018

Basis for Determination:

Based on interviews, medical documentation, and documentation received from LE, the allegations were substantiated against the mother and the PS for the SC and the SS. Upon investigation it was learned the PS was impaired and the mother knew that he was impaired when he drove the children to school that morning. The SS told LE that the SC unfastened his seat belt to wake the PS who kept falling asleep while driving. As a result, there was a fatal car crash and the SC died from the injuries he sustained. The SS sustained multiple injuries as well. The case was indicated and opened.

OCFS Review Results:

There were incorrect answers to 2 of the Elevated Risk Elements, that the SC's death was a result of maltreatment, and that the CHN sustained serious physical injuries requiring hospitalization. This impacts the assessment of future risk to the SS. SCDSS did not attempt to interview the PS as per regulation.

The SCR report alleged for the past 8 years, the mother used heroin on a regular basis to the point of impairment while caring for the children. The mother and the parent substitute also sold drugs on the street and took the children with them to make the drug drops. The role of the father was unknown.
