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This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report alleged on 4/15/19 the 2-week-old infant was found unresponsive and cold to the touch in the home by the visiting nurse sometime between 11:00 AM and 12:12 PM. The mother and the father last heard the infant cry at approxmately 11:00 AM, but it was unknown if they had physically checked on the infant. At the time the infant was found unresponsive, she was seated in her car seat in the home. It was unclear how long the infant had been in the car seat. The infant did not have any pre-existing medical conditions and was an otherwise healthy child, making the infant's death suspicious.

Executive Summary

This report concerns the death of a 15-day-old female child. Oneida County Department of Social Services (OCDSS) received an SCR report on 4/15/19 regarding the death of the subject child. On 4/15/19 the mother had placed the subject child in her car seat as she planned to take the subject child to the emergency room because of her breathing. The mother was receiving visiting nursing services for the subject child. The nurse arrived before the mother left for the hospital. The nurse attempted to take the subject child's temperature, but had difficulty. The mother removed the subject child from the car seat and the subject child was not breathing. The nurse called 911 at 12:10 PM and attempted CPR until EMS arrived. The subject child was transported to the hospital where she was pronounced deceased.

OCDSS assessed the safety of the two surviving siblings (ages 2 and 3 years old) and interviewed the parents and family members and there were no noted safety concerns for the surviving siblings.

The medical examiner's office told OCDSS that the final autopsy report listed the cause of death as respiratory complications due to pneumonia and the manner of death was natural causes. Law enforcement investigated the fatality and concluded their investigation, finding no criminality involved in the death of the subject child.

OCDSS completed all safety assessments and required reports accurately and on time. OCDSS obtained medical and law enforcement records, interviewed family members and several collaterals about the care of the subject child. There were no noted concerns about the care of the subject child by the parents. OCDSS appropriately unsubstantiated the allegations of DOA/fatality and inadequate guardianship against the parents for the subject child. There was no credible evidence that the parents caused the death of the subject child. The family was involved in bereavement services through their religious community and had the support of family. The case was unfounded and closed.

LDSS Response

On 4/15/19, OCDSS received the fatality report from the SCR. OCDSS coordinated with law enforcement, completed a CPS history check, notified the medical examiner's office and the district attorney's office of the death. The surviving sibling was assessed and there were no noted safety concerns.

On 4/15/19, OCDSS went to the police barracks where they observed the interview with the mother by law enforcement. The mother told law enforcement she spoke English and did not require an interpreter. The mother said the subject child woke that morning at 8:00 AM. The mother fed the subject child, but the mother said she noticed the subject child was not feeling well. The mother said she sat on the couch holding the subject child from 8:00 AM to 10:30 AM. The mother said the subject child went down for a nap at 10:30 AM and woke at 11:00 AM. The mother said the subject child had a stuffy nose and she used a suction device to clear her nose. The mother said the subject child was still having trouble breathing. The mother said she had brought the subject to the doctor on 4/11/19 and was diagnosed with Respiratory Syncytial Virus. The doctor's office instructed her to bring the child to the emergency room if the subject child got worse. The mother said she had placed the subject child in the car seat as she was intending to take the subject child to the hospital. The mother said she had a scheduled appointment with her visiting nurse for that day and the nurse arrived early. The nurse noticed the subject child was not breathing when she arrived. The nurse called 911 and the subject was transported to the hospital.

OCDSS interviewed the visiting nurse and her statement was consistent with the mother's statement. The visiting nurse said she had been to the home a few times and had no concerns for the care the mother was providing the subject child.

OCDSS interviewed the father and he had no concerns for the care of the subject child or the surviving sibling while in the care of their mother. The father was not at home at the time of the fatal incident. OCDSS offered the mother and the father referrals for bereavement services and they declined. OCDSS appropriately questioned the mother about safe sleep and mother was aware of safe sleep and was practicing safe sleep. A portable crib and a bassinet were observed in the home with no noted safety concerns. The parents denied drug/alcohol misuse and there was no evidence of alcohol or drugs in the home.

OCDSS observed the surviving siblings (ages 3 and 2 years old) and there were no noted safety concerns. OCDSS made follow up home visits to the home and there were no noted safety concerns for the care of the surviving siblings.

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OCDSS obtained information from law enforcement, the medical examiner, emergency services, medical records from the hospital, and the children's pediatrician. The children's pediatric records noted no concerns for their care by the parents.
